

### Adjectives



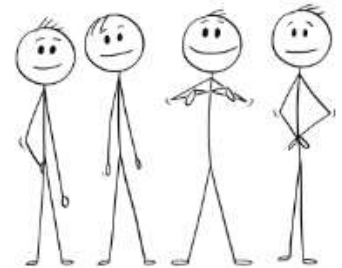
An adjective tells us about an object (noun).

It describes the noun and usually comes before the noun

Example: The sleepy cat fell off the wide window sill.  
This is the bigger stone of the two.

An adjective can describe the best or most or more than two things.  
(degrees of comparison)

Example: This is the **biggest** stone of all.



### Adverbs of time and frequency

**Adverbs describe a verb.**

Adverbs of time tell us when something happened.

Example: Yesterday I had a bad headache.  
We will soon arrive in Cape Town.

Adverbs of frequency tell us how often something happened.  
**yesterday, tomorrow, today, last week, soon, always, never.**

Example: My mother often bakes rusks.  
At school we always listen.
