Adjectives

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An adjective tells us about an object (noun).


It describes the noun and usually comes before the noun

Example: The <u>sleepy</u> cat fell off the <u>wide</u> <u>window</u> sill.

This is the bigger stone of the two.

An adjective can describe the <u>best</u> or <u>most</u> or <u>more</u> than two things. (degrees of comparison)

Example: This is the **biggest** stone of all.



Adverbs of time and frequency

Adverbs describe a verb.

Adverbs of time tell us when something happened.

Example: <u>Yesterday</u> I had a bad headache.

We will **soon** arrive in Cape Town.

Adverbs of <u>frequency</u> tell us <u>how often</u> something happened. **yesterday**, tomorrow, today, last week, soon, always, never.

Example: My mother <u>often</u> bakes rusks.

At school we <u>always</u> listen.
